President's Message

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS SINCE MAN FIRST WALKED ON MOON

Do you remember where you were on July 20 1969 when man first walked on the moon? The landing of two American astronauts on the moon was watched on live television by 500 million people

around the world, you and me included. Where were you on that very special day? I was glued to the TV in my home in Calgary Alberta. My guess is everyone reading this can remember where they were when Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin's voice cracked out "Tranquility Base, The Eagle has landed." Those were very exciting words.to me.

When Neil Armstrong's boots scuffed the lunar dust for the first time and he uttered the thrilling words "One small step for man and one giant leap forward for mankind". Unknown to the space agency, Buzz Aldrin had concealed a small vial of wine and a cracker in his space suit. Soon after landing he celebrated a private communion.

The entire Apollo 11 rocket weighed 6½ million pounds at launch. Only 10 thousand pounds returned to earth. The Eagle Moon lander had only 20 seconds worth of fuel left as it touched down. The Apollo 11 spacecraft re-entered the Earth's atmosphere at a speed of over 24,000 miles per hour or 7 miles per second. It is not known at this time whether the next manned flight will be to the moon, an asteroid or Mars.

July speaker - July 3rd - Tom Rosebush - our own Ajax PROBUS member. He is going to speak on the genealogy of his family and how he lost his family and then discovered family members he had never known many years later.

August 7th speaker: - Darcy Jenish. His subject is: "The making of the October Crisis: Canada's long nightmare of terrorism at the hands of the FLQ". I think most of us will remember that particular reign of terror in October 1970 and Pierre Trudeau invoking The War Measures Act. The British Trade Minister, James Cross and a Cabinet Minister, Pierre LaPorte were kidnapped and Mr. LaPorte was subsequently found in the trunk of a car, having been strangled by the FLQ. This should be a fascinating presentation and will bring back many memories of those dark days in Canada's history.





September 4th speaker is Cathy McWatters who is a noted astronomer. Ms. McWatters was going to be our speaker in February but a blizzard caused the meeting to be cancelled.

Ms McWatters will speak to us of the wonders of the universe and what to see in the night sky.

October 2nd speaker: - Circles Enrichment group will do a presentation on Frank Sinatra - the man and the music.





November 6th speaker:- Doug Tozer. Mr. Tozer will speak to us on the Great Lakes waterbirds and other wildlife, particularly around Lake Erie and how complex ecological processes are having a negative impact on nesting and migration. Mr. Tozer is a Bird Studies Canada Ontario Program Scientist. This is a very topical subject in view of the concerns about climate change and pollution so should be thought provoking.



Bridging the Gap - Opener's Rebid - Part 2 Spade Responses

What would you bid in the following situations?

Opener Responder 1 Club 1 Spade

Clubs AQ972 Diamonds K5 Hearts 35 Spades AKJ4 Clubs AK6 Diamonds 87 Hearts KQ98 Spades AQ54

A bid of 3 Spades shows more than a minimum hand (16 to 18 points) and 4 card spade support. In the second example there is no point in showing your hearts. It is better to confirm the suit for the contact and tell partner of your point count. They can then decide whether there is no game, a game or a slam.



Age-Friendly Ajax Update

On Thursday, June 20, 2019, the Town of Ajax held its first ever Age-Friendly Ajax Community Planning Conference. This was an opportunity for Ajax residents, businesses, social service agencies, not-for-profit organizations and local clubs to come together for a day of discussion to help identify shared priorities for creating an age-friendly community. The conference saw approximately 75 delegates participate in conversations related to the age-friendly community features, including:

- Transportation
- Housing
- Communication & Information
- Social Participation, Respect & Inclusion
- Community Support & Health Services
- Civic Participation & Employment
- Outdoor Spaces & Buildings

Conference delegates had the opportunity to examine each community feature through survey questions, open discussions and a mapping exercise, with the goal of identifying specific age-friendly strengths, challenges and opportunities present in the Ajax community.

The information gathered from the conference will be instrumental in helping to build the Age-Friendly Ajax Community Plan. This plan will give municipal departments, not-for-profit organizations, local business, service providers, and community groups one common vision for fostering healthy and active aging in Ajax.

Your Voice is Important!

Consultation with the people who call Ajax home is the best foundation for building the future of an age-friendly Ajax. There is still time and opportunity to share your insights, experience and knowledge to help shape the Age-Friendly Ajax Community Plan.
