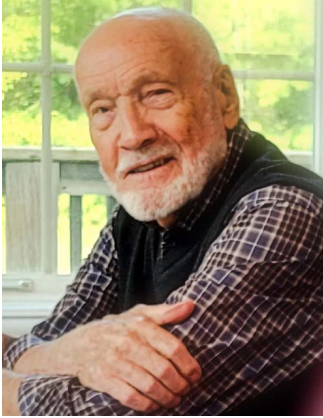
BY-LAW CHANGES

CARS IN CUBA

A major fascination while we were visiting Cuba is their famous classic cars, almost like being at a virtual car show. But what is the story behind the proliferation of classic American cars mostly from the 50's in Cuba? Before the revolution, American cars were imported into Cuba for about 50 years. At this time Cuba had a strong middle class with a passion for American cars. After the revolution in 1959, the U.S. embargo was erected and Castro banned the importation of American cars and parts.

So all this time the old American cars have been kept running by Cuban ingenuity. Classic cars become family heirlooms. These owners have become make shift mechanics, using parts and pieces never intended for them, such as tractor and lawn mower parts, engines from cars and diesel trucks from Russia, Japan, China ... Many of the most beautifully restored cars are used as taxis and can be seen at the resorts all around the island.

On our bus trip to Cuba's birding spots, we saw many of these old cars along the streets, in driveways and in front yards. We also saw many motorcycles and bicycles. 'Auto-rickshaws' and 'Bicitaxis' Cuban 3-wheeled taxis, some motorized and others pedal-powered. And in many areas, Cubans are still getting around by real horse power. On our birding tour through the mountains, the group had the pleasure of a bumpy ride in the back of an old Russian army truck. If anyone is a car enthusiast, a tour of Cuba should be a must.

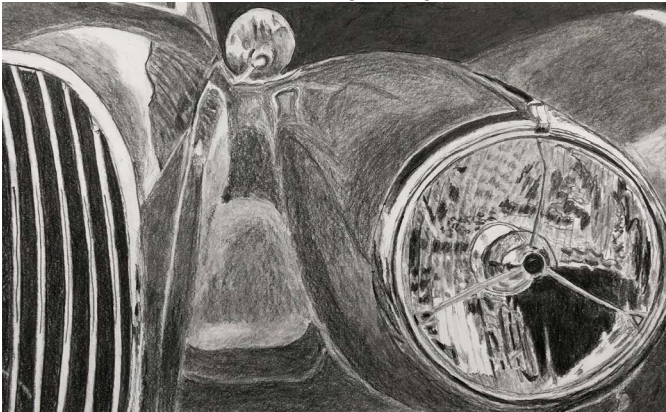

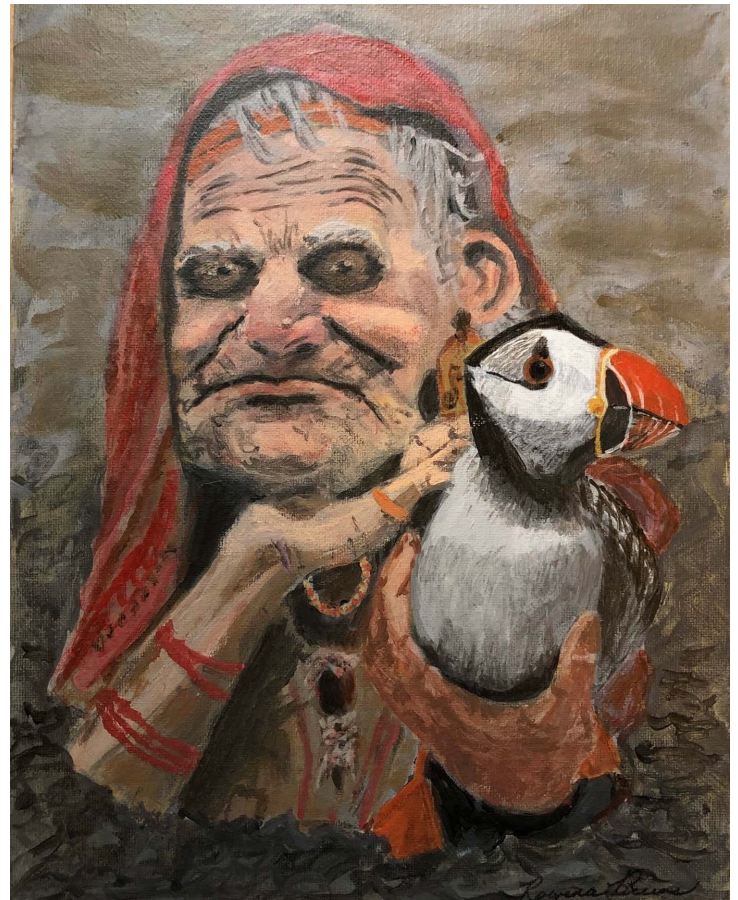

RECIPES OF THE MONTH

FALL-OFF-THE-BONE OVEN-BAKED RIBS



2 racks baby back or side pork ribs, cut to fit pot
1 tbsp brown sugar (optional)
1 tbsp dry mustard
1 tbsp garlic powder
1 tsp salt
1 tsp pepper, cayenne pepper or sriracha sauce
Your favourite BBQ sauce for glaze

1. If there's a membrane on back of ribs, remove it. In a large pot, bring ribs to a boil and simmer for 45 minutes. Heat oven to 350.
2. Line a baking pan with foil. Mix the sugar & seasonings and rub into all sides of the ribs.
3. Place ribs meat-side down, cover tightly with foil and bake for 2½ hours. Remove from oven.
4. Slather ribs on all sides with BBQ sauce. Cook, meat-side up, uncovered, for another 15-20 minutes until sauce is caramelized or finish on BBQ if preferred.

CREAMY BAKED MASHED POTATOES



10 large Russet or Yukon Gold potatoes
2 eggs
8-ozs cream cheese
1 cup sour cream
1 tbsp butter
Salt and pepper to taste
Paprika & chopped chives (optional)

1. Boil and mash potatoes.
2. Add all other ingredients and beat with an electric mixer until fluffy.
3. Transfer potatoes mixture to a buttered casserole dish and sprinkle top with paprika and chopped chives if using.
4. Bake in pre-heated 350 oven for 20-30 minutes or until the top is golden brown and slightly crispy.

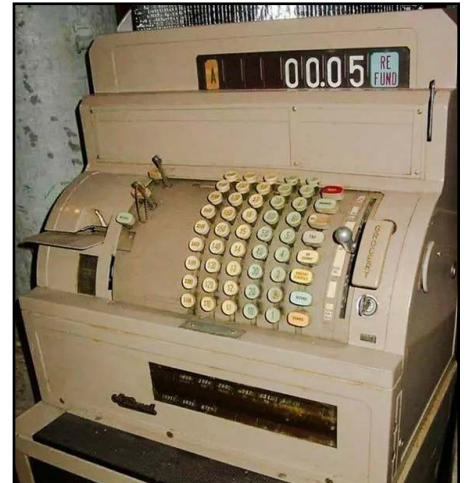
