President's Message



An early spring!!! At least, that's what "Wiarton Willie" predicted. Did you ever wonder how a hibernating rodent became a meteorologist, predicting the weather?

Groundhog Day is a popular American and Canadian tradition observed on February 2nd of each year. It derives from a Pennsylvania Dutch superstition. The first Groundhog Day was

celebrated in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania in 1886. Every year 40,000 people converge on this town of 5,000 to see "Punxsutawney Phil" emerge from his burrow.

In Canada, there are several Groundhog Day celebrations. Due to Nova Scotia's Atlantic Time zone, "Shubenacadie Sam" of Lunenburg makes the first Groundhog Day prediction in North America. In Quebec "Fred la Marmotte" of Val D'Espoir has been the forecaster since 2009.

Wiarton Willie of Ontario is the most famous groundhog in Canada as well as the only albino weather prognosticator in the world. Each year, media from around the world converge on Wiarton to hear Willie make his famous prediction. On February 2^{nd} 2020 at 8:07am, Willie predicted an early spring.

Some other furry prognosticators in the United States include "Milltown Mel" of New Jersey fame. Each year coffee and doughnuts are donated by the event's sponsor Bronson and Guthlein Funeral Home.

In 2015, "Jimmy" the weather predictor for Sun Prairie, Wisconsin bit the ear of the then Mayor Jon Freund. The next day a mayoral proclamation absolved Jimmy of any wrongdoing.

In Washington DC the Groundhog Day event features "Potomac Phil" who in 2019, according to Wikipedia, not only predicted the weather but also predicted two more years of political insanity.

Groundhog Day in New York City features "Staten Island Chuck". "Dunkirk Dave" predicts the weather in Western New York.

In the southern United States, "Sir Walter Wally"s predictions in Raleigh, North Carolina are 58% correct. Elsewhere in the American South "General Beauregard Lee" makes predictions from Lilburn, Georgia.

So that's the story about the origin and history of Groundhog Day. Let's hope Wiarton Willie is correct and we see an early spring this year. Frankly I've had enough winter.

For March our speaker will be Martin Franssen, a Detective with the Fraud Division of the Major Crimes Unit, Durham Regional Police. Martin will speak about the various types of fraud perpetrated on the public and how to prevent becoming a victim of fraud. He will also speak about safeguards when preparing a Power of Attorney.

Our April speaker will be Dr. Doug Tozer from Long Point, Ontario. Doug is an Ontario Program Scientist with Bird Studies Canada. He is a specialist on the birds and wildlife of the great lakes, including migration and the impact of climate and human encroachment on wetlands where birds and wildlife are being displaced.

Our May speaker is Eric Conroy who is the President of the organization that has salvaged and restored the SS Keewatin. This huge ship, the last of the Great Lakes steam ships, is presently lying at Port McNicoll and is undergoing work to restore it to its original condition. The Keewatin plied the Great Lakes back in the 1920's and 1930's and was built to emulate a smaller version of the Titanic. Many of the cabins display clothing and artifacts from the time period when the ship was operating on the lakes and the furniture and fittings throughout the ship are from that time period also. A day trip is planned to explore this historic ship in the summer. You will find more information about this outing in the social announcements below (July).

We are currently working on speakers for the balance of 2020, June through November. **Possible speakers are as follows:**

- 1] The Bees Knees Apiary. This is a local apiary and is run by a mother and daughter who produce award winning honey. They will speak about the important role that bees have as pollinators together with interesting information on the life and habits of bees and how these small creatures impact our lives.
- 2] Soper Creek Wildlife Rescue, from Bowmanville. They rehabilitate injured and sick wildlife and release them back into the wild. This organization goes out to various schools and social clubs and is operated by a dedicated team of educators who travel across Ontario, spreading the word about the importance of backyard conservation and co-existence with wildlife.
- 3] We have also been investigating a speaker who is a local author. She has written some books on Princess Diana. She would be willing to do a presentation for us on "Princess Diana her life and times".

Keewatin was one of six ships owned by Canadian Pacific Railways to sail the Upper Great Lakes. Begun in 1883 to link the eastern and western railheads, this line of ships populated the west and was specifically responsible for the economic development of Alberta and Saskatchewan that brought those provinces into Confederation in 1905 by providing vast numbers of immigrants plus equipment and supplies, and carrying millions of tons of grain to market in the east on their downward trips. S.S. Keewatin began her service in the Canadian Pacific Railroad Great Lakes Steamship fleet in 1907. Built in Glasgow, Scotland.


