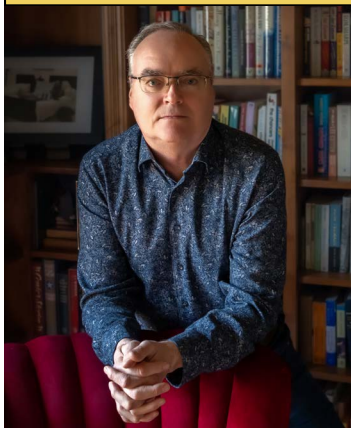

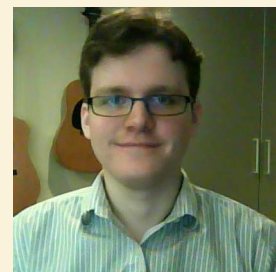


DOLLY PARTON: BEYOND THE RHINESTONES

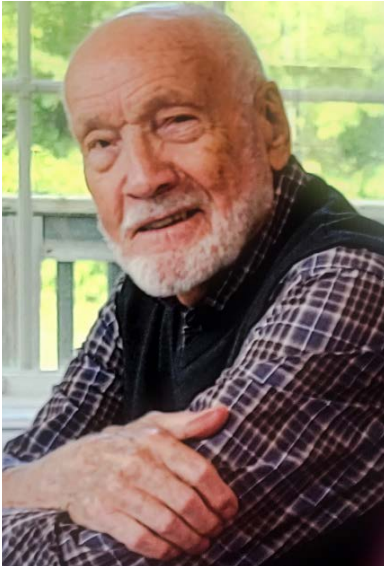

LOVE MADE IMMORTAL

On a recent visit to my friend's place in Huntsville to see the fall colours, she took us up a long, steep, winding one lane roadway to a small landing overlooking the Big East River. At the parking area there is a small sign informing us that we are visiting the Dyer Memorial. Then a few steps from it, we found ourselves at the foot of a large stone staircase leading to an impressive obelisk reaching up into the sky – a memorial to Clifton Dyer's love of his life – his wife, Betsy Browne Dyer, on her death in 1956. On either side of the staircase Clifton Dyer planted a small forest of towering pines that Bessie loved so much. Bessie's ashes are placed in a copper urn at the top of the memorial. So she will never have to leave her favourite place. His ashes joined hers a few years later.

The Dyers from Detroit spent their honeymoon in 1916 in this area and since then visited often, camping and hiking in summers and skiing in winter, eventually building a permanent cottage there. After both of their deaths, the Dyer's trust money helped to maintain the property until it ran out in the early 2000's. After a few years in decline, Muskoka Conservancy stepped in to restore it and introduced an initiative that allows people to memorialize a loved one, or an event with a memorial tree. It is now a lovely park atop the hill surrounded by trees, a pond and hiking trails. A beautiful setting, breathtaking views and a tale of love everlasting – what more could one ask?

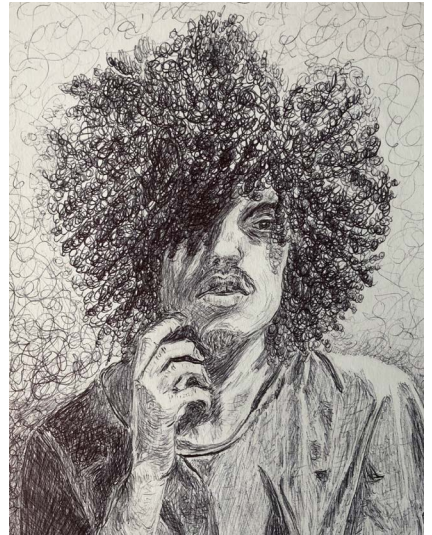

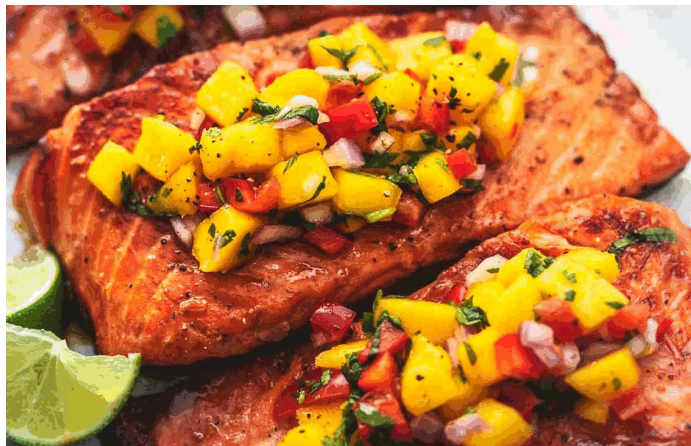

RECIPES OF THE MONTH



HONEY-LIME SALMON WITH MANGO SALSA



- 4 6-ounce salmon fillets
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- Salt & pepper
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons honey

Mango Salsa:

- 2 large mangoes - diced
- 1 red bell pepper - diced
- ½ red onion - diced
- 1 cup fresh or ½ cup dried cilantro
- juice of 1 lime & salt to taste

Prepare the salsa: Combine mangoes, bell peppers, onions, and cilantro. Add lime juice and salt and stir well. Add salt to taste. Set aside.

Prepare the salmon:

1. Rub salmon with olive oil & season generously with salt and pepper.
2. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Once butter is just melted, stir in honey.
3. Arrange salmon fillets in the pan and cook for 4-5 minutes.
4. Flip salmon over and cook another 5-8 minutes until opaque throughout and salmon is caramelized on the outside.
5. Serve with mango salsa.

To save time, use a jar of salsa such as President's Choice Mango/Lime, but fresh is best!

BAKED SWEET POTATO & BUTTERNUT SQUASH



- 4 large sweet potatoes
- 1 bag of frozen butternut squash
- 2-3 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons dried parsley
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- Salt & pepper to taste
- Grated Cheddar cheese to cover top

1. Boil the potatoes for 10 minutes.
2. Add the squash and continue to cook until potatoes are fork tender.
2. Drain and mash with butter until smooth.
3. Mix with all the seasonings and add to a greased casserole.
4. Top with enough grated cheddar to cover and bake at 350 until cheese is golden.

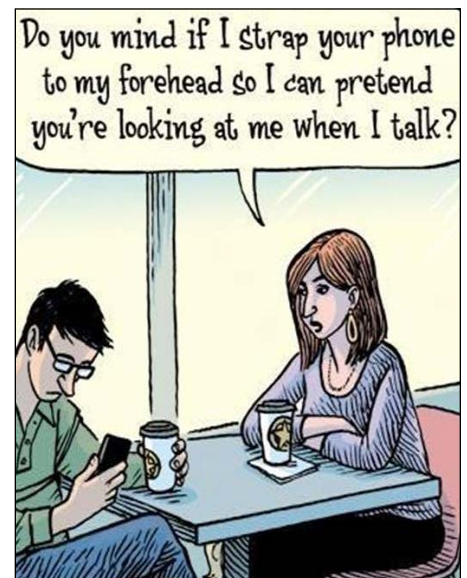

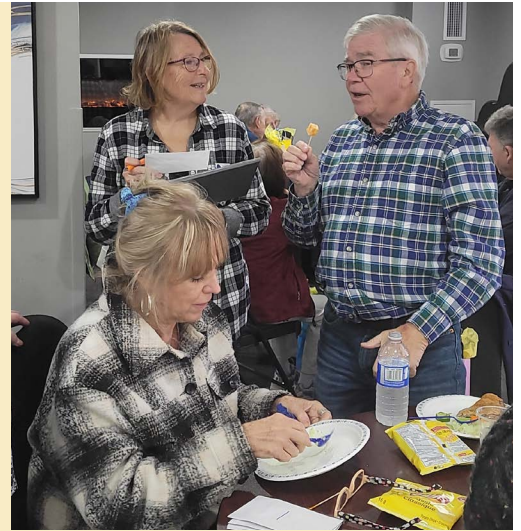
