

LEN CULLEN AND HIS GARDENS


I'm sure everyone living in this area over the last 50 years will remember Len Cullen. First Weall and Cullen Nurseries and Cullen Country Barns, then most of us can remember visiting Cullen Gardens and Miniature Village – now a distant memory. But Len Cullen, who died in 2006, now overlooks the site of his former dream property in the form of a life size bronze sculpture by the artist Ruth Abernathy. The bronze Len Cullen stands at the entrance overlooking the valley venue of his former miniature village and the Park of Reflection, a recent addition.

The Cullen property was sold to the Town of Whitby and in 2008, Whitby council voted to set aside the majority of lands as public open space. Two buildings on the property also belonged to the Cullen family – their family summer home and a log cabin bought by the Cullens and moved to the property.

Our Probus walking group has used this lovely property as a walk venue or a meeting spot to begin our walk towards and into the adjacent Heber Down Conservation Area.

"PASTA" WITH OLIVE OIL SAUCE (Keto)



 package of any <u>NuPasta</u> Konjac noodles (zero net carbs) - serves 2
 cup Extra Virgin Olive Oil
 chopped garlic cloves & 1 tbsp oregano
 cup chopped fresh parsley or 1/2 cup dried parsley
 cup crumbled parmesan or feta
 Whatever you have on hand, such as:
 onions, mushrooms, roasted peppers, asparagus, snowpeas, anchovies, capers, and kalamata pitted olives.

- 1. Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Lower the heat and add garlic, oregano and a pinch of salt and pepper. Cook for a minute.
- 2. Sauté the onions until softened and then add the remaining ingredients.
- 3. Add the NuPasta (rinsed very well and drained) and heat through.
- 4. To serve, add more olive oil if required and sprinkle with red pepper flakes to taste.

NOTES:

This recipe is great for diabetics, or for anyone watching their carb or gluten intake. It can be served as a main dish or side. It goes particularly well with wild salmon or rainbow trout, cooked whole, or cut into bite-size pieces and added to the mixture in the pan. Don't be put off by NuPasta's smell. Rinsing it well will remove it. NuPasta is pre-cooked and the texture is a bit more chewy than regular pasta. It can be used in any pasta recipe.

HEALTHY BLUEBERRY MUFFINS



2½ cups fine grind Almond Flour (such as President's Choice)
½ cup milled flax seeds
½ cup sugar substitute such as Monk Fruit/Erythritol blend
1½ tsps baking powder (non-GMO, aluminum-free, such as Bakers)
¼ tsp salt

1/2 tsp of pure vanilla extract

½ cup virgin coconut oil or butter (measured solid) then melted & cooled.
½ cup unsweetened almond milk or regular milk at room temperature.
3 large eggs at room temperature (beaten until light and frothy)
2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

- 1. In a large bowl, stir together all the dry ingredients.
- 2. Beat in the melted coconut oil/butter, milk, beaten eggs and vanilla. The batter will be fairly thick.
- 3. Fold in the blueberries.
- Transfer the batter to baking cups and bake until the tops are golden and an inserted toothpick comes out clean - about 35 minutes, depending on the size. Makes 9-12 muffins. Keeps very well in the freezer.



How to Make an e-transfer to Ajax Probus to pay for membership fees or events

Please advise the Social Chair, Shirlie Van Putten or Membership Chair, Tom Rosebush that you are making an e-transfer.

Each bank has a slightly different system, however the steps are the same, but may be in a different order.

- 1) Sign in to your online banking account and select "Interac e-Transfer"
- 2) Select "Send Money" or whatever name your bank calls it.
- 3) Select the account that the funds are to be withdrawn from.
- 4) In the Amount field, enter the amount you are sending.
- 5) Enter the recipient: (each bank is slightly different in the way this works).
 - Select: Enter New Recipient (if Probus Club of Ajax isn't already listed as a recipient).
 - add the name: Probus Club of Ajax
 - enter the email address: probusajaxtreasurer@gmail.com
- 6) In the Comments box, enter
 - Your name (and other names if it is for more than one person).
 - What the money is for. *If you do not put anything in the comments, we won't know what the funds are for.*
- 7) Review and Finish Transaction. The funds will be in our account immediately.
