PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm sure we're all tired of the social isolation we have endured in the past months due to the pandemic. With vaccination rates climbing every day and the Ontario Government's implementation of Step 3 of the re-opening, we are beginning to see a light at the end of the tunnel.

According to the COVID-19 Vaccine Tracker, as of July 21, 2021, more than 80% of adults (18+) in Ontario have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, while more than 68% of adults (18+) in Ontario are fully vaccinated.

At the Management Committee meeting on July 16, 2021, a Protocol was developed and passed to begin a cautious re-opening of our PROBUS Club's meetings and activities. Our goal is to provide as safe an environment as possible for our members. This Protocol reads "For the foreseeable future, all in-person gatherings of the PROBUS Club of Ajax will require all participants to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. In addition, a minimum of two weeks must have passed since the second shot was administered. These vaccination requirements include, but are not limited to, our monthly membership meetings, interest group activities, and social events." To learn more about this Protocol, its' implementation and how it affects you, please read the actual Protocol on page #2 of this Newsletter.

With respect to a gradual re-opening, our Club is planning Hybrid meetings, to be implemented in the fall of this year. A Hybrid meeting allows in-person attendance at the meeting, as well as remote viewing of the meeting via Zoom. Our Club hopes to have our first Hybrid membership meeting on October 6, 2021 however, the timing will depend upon Province of Ontario Regulations and Public Health Guidelines for COVID-19, in effect at that time.

Hope you are enjoying our summer weather. It's hard to believe that we are approaching the end of July already. Wishing you an enjoyable Civic Holiday!

COVID-19 PROTOCOL PROBUS CLUB OF AJAX

The PROBUS Club of Ajax is a private social club for seniors. Given the ages of our members, it is imperative that safety be our highest priority. Our Club must manage the risk of COVID-19, as we re-introduce in-person meetings and activities. With this in mind, the Management Committee formulated the following Protocol:

For the foreseeable future, all in-person gatherings of the PROBUS Club of Ajax, will require all participants to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. In addition, a minimum of two weeks must have passed since the second shot was administered. These vaccination requirements include, but are not limited to, our monthly membership meetings, interest group activities, and social events.

This is how it will work:

- a) When you are vaccinated for COVID-19, you receive a Ministry of Health receipt for each shot. When you attend your first in-person membership meeting, bring the receipt for your second vaccine shot with you. Your name and the date of your second shot will be recorded, when you enter the meeting room. You will not need to show your vaccination receipt again. The Social Co-ordinator, Interest Group Co-ordinator and House Co-ordinator for membership meetings will have access to a list of fully vaccinated Club members, and use this list when approving attendance at their respective activities.
- b) This COVID-19 Protocol will be implemented at our Club's first in-person membership meeting, tentatively scheduled for October 6, 2021. This date gives Club members a two month period in which to become fully vaccinated, in order to comply with this protocol.
- c) If you decide not to be vaccinated for COVID-19, you may attend any virtual events offered by the PROBUS Club of Ajax. This includes our Hybrid membership meetings, and Interest Groups provided on Zoom and Trickster. Please do not attend any in-person meetings, interest group activities or social events etc. held by the PROBUS Club of Ajax.
- d) All COVID-19 Province of Ontario Regulations and Public Health Guidelines in effect at the time of the PROBUS Club of Ajax in-person gatherings will prevail, including group size, physical distancing, mask requirements etc.

As stated above, member safety is of paramount importance within our Club. If you have any questions, please email them to ajaxprobuspresident@gmail.com.

I'm sure we're all looking forward to the opportunity of meeting again in-person. What a joy it will be to socialize with friends we haven't seen for many months.

As of July 20th, we have received 91 renewals or 44% of our membership. This leaves 116 members still to be heard from.



Three Bean Salad



1 Can (19 oz) cut Yellow Beans

1 Can (15 oz) dark red Kidney Beans

1/4 cup fresh lime juice

½ cup Chopped Green Pepper

Dressing:

½ cup Sugar

2/3 cup Vinegar

1/3 cup Salad Oil

Salt & Pepper to taste

Drain beans and combine with green pepper. Combine ingredients for dressing. Toss in large bowl and chill overnight. Serves 6 – 8

You can even add a can of chickpeas if you choose.

Can be kept in fridge for up to a month!

A TRIP TO REMEMBER by Sylvia Clark

In the summer of 1970, my husband, my 3 children and myself were living in Montreal. Our extended families lived on Vancouver Island B.C. It was decided I would take the children (the youngest 3 years old, one 6 years old and the eldest 9 years old) out to Vancouver by train, then cross to the Island by ferry. We would stay one month with our parents. My husband would fly out for the last week and we would all return home together on the train.

We had a bedroom on the train and the children loved the freedom of moving back and forth between the train cars, being served fancy meals in the dining car and watching the scenery race by.

When we got to the ferry dock, I was delighted to see my parents had come over on the previous ferry to meet us. As we embarked on "The Queen of Victoria" I decided to use their phone booth and call Steve's parents to let them know the approximate time we would be arriving in Swartz Bay on the Island. Following that, the six of us went to the café, took a corner window and ordered lunch. As the ferry entered Active Pass my father looked out the window and exclaimed "That freighter is going too fast. It is going to hit us!" We each grabbed a child. I remembered shouting "Hold on to something, we are going to crash!" BEDLAM FOLLOWED.

The Soviet freighter 'Sergay Ysenin' hit us midship and was lodged tightly into the ferry inches from the phone booth I had previously used.

It appeared there were only a couple of officers dashing about hustling us into life jackets, none of which fit my 3-year-old. I had to hold her inside my life jacket. The next problem was trying to get the wooden lifeboats loose. When that didn't work, they resorted to the inflatables. A very slim Chinese kitchen worker was handed an oar and thrust into the inflatable with about a dozen of us, as we were very shakily lowered to the water.

Fortunately, nearby fishing boats came to our rescue and helped us climb up into their boats. After about an hour, when they realized the ferry wasn't going to sink, the freighter backed out and they instructed everyone to get back on the ferry. No one was happy about that! Police were helicoptered in. Everyone was questioned. Finally, the ferry slowly returned to Tsawwassen dock. Hours later they let us leave on a different ferry to make our way to Swartz Bay where my brother waited for us with open arms.

We later learned that three passengers had been killed. Since that date, August 2nd 1970, no freighters are permitted to travel through Active Pass. Plus, no passengers are allowed to remain in their cars during the crossing.

It was definitely a TRIP TO REMEMBER. On the ferry ride home on the "Queen of Saanich" both boys spent the whole trip outside at the rail watching out for possible danger.




September 1st Speaker

Operation Angus is a follow up to my first two novels, The Best Laid Plans (Leacock Medal winner, CBC Canada Reads winner, CBC Television 6-part miniseries, and a stage musical) and *The High Road*. Yes, Angus McLintock is back 14 years after he first appeared in my debut novel. While Angus is a newly minted cabinet minister, this story is less about politics and more of a comic thriller as Angus and his Chief of Staff, narrator Daniel Addison must, on their own, thwart an assassination attempt on the life of the Russian President during a brief meeting with the Prime Minister in Ottawa.

In my talk, I'll share the roots of this novel and my own connections to the story.

COVID and BRIDGE BRIDGING the GAP

For the past four months we have been talking about some difficult hands to bid. These hands look straight forward but can trap you. This month we have another problem hand. Look at this innocuous hand. (Spades) 8, (Hearts) A43, (Diamonds) K1052, (Clubs) KQ1042. What do you bid? You have a 5 card club suit and a 4 card diamond suit. You have a basic opening bid (12 High card points plus one or 2 distribution points). Let's say you fall into the trap and open 1 club. Partner bids 1 spade. What do you bid now? A bid of 1NT would be difficult to play with a singleton in partner's suit. A bid of 2 diamonds is a reverse and promises 17 or more points. The problem was with the first bid. You should have opened 1 Diamond. Here is a rule. If you have 5 clubs and 4 diamonds and a singleton or void in a major suit always open 1 diamond. Remember Alvin Roth's advice from last month: Don't make your first bid until you know what your second bid will be. There seems to be a Murphy's Law in bridge that partner will always bid the suit that you do not want them to bid. Harvey Brodhecker

Rambles with my Camera - Whitby Waterfront Trail

One place I love to walk with my camera, especially at this time of year is the waterfront trail in Whitby between Blair Street south and Thickson Road. It had been closed since the spring and finally opened up a few weeks ago with newly paved trails and improved seating areas. The wildflowers during the summer months are spectacular and a favourite challenge is to see if I can catch the birds and butterflies landing in the wildflowers. I have included a few in this collage. Some know about the secret footpath that runs parallel with the paved trail. It has amazing views over the lake and down to the shore. I had walked this trail a few weeks ago and noticed throngs of swallows overhead catching beak loads of flying insects and swooping down the cliff side. I followed the trail until it took me to a spot that overlooked the cliff and I could see that it was dotted with small openings. The cliff swallows were momentarily disappearing into one of these openings and then out again. I returned to this spot wondering if I could see the chicks. I took more shots and concentrated my zoom lens on the swallows that were hovering in front of the openings hoping I might see something interesting when I download my pictures and I wasn't disappointed. Some of the baby swallows are getting big enough that they are reaching out of their cave nests trying to be the successful recipient. I have included 2 shots that I was especially happy with. Try to zoom in if you can to see the chicks.

THE BOOKWORM



I've just rediscovered Barbara Kingsolver. One book led to another, and summer days slipped by as I happily read on my backyard swing surrounded by my flower garden.

In the summer of 1998, it seemed everyone in Toronto was reading bestseller, "The Poisonwood Bible" about a missionary family in Belgian Congo, tracing the Congo's struggle for independence. I loved it and was immediately drawn into the family dynamics and political turmoil of the story.

I followed that with, "Prodigal Summer" about a small Appalachian town during a single summer. The characters are Deanna, a solitary woman working as a park ranger, Lusa, a widowed entomologist, and Garrett, an old man with dreams of restoring the lineage of the extinct American chestnut tree.

Known for her historical fiction, Kingsolver explores themes of social justice, biodiversity, and the balance between the needs of individuals, their communities, and the ecosystem. Using beautiful prose and strong narrative, her books have been called a form of social activism. Her characters are often outsiders, and she questions, "How can the common person work so hard all their life and make so little progress and have so little to show for it?"

"Unsheltered" is her latest work, published in 2018. It follows two families in the same house at two separate time periods in Vineland, New Jersey. One family lived in the house in the 1800's when debates about Darwin's, "On the Origin of Species" prevailed and women were arrested for wearing trousers. Their next-door neighbour is Mary Treat, the real-life naturalist, botanist and entomologist. The modern-day family is writer Willa and her husband lano, who struggle with finances and a stable home while raising their baby grandson, Dusty in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. The two stories are woven together beautifully for a surprising conclusion.

"The Bean Trees," Barbara Kingsolver's first book, was published in 1988 and is now a classic. It's a coming-of-age story of Taylor Greer who leaves home, driving west from Kentucky to Oklahoma and Arizona. Along the way she finds herself in Cherokee territory when a woman approaches and leaves a child with her without any explanation. Taylor adopts three-year-old Turtle and with her mother Alice and boyfriend Jax, they become a family.

The sequel, "Pigs in Heaven" continues the story of Taylor and her daughter, with special attention to the customs, tradition, and history of the Cherokee nation in Oklahoma. Critics have said Kingsolver may have written the sequel to correct misconceptions in the first book about the disproportionately high rate of adoptions of aboriginal children into white families.


It's interesting to observe a writer's style as it evolves with different works. While "The Poisonwood Bible" remains my favorite of Kingsolver's books, I think "Unsheltered" places a solid second. There's a lightness and irony in her writing that had me smiling. Her characters are quirky and fun. Yet, she somehow seems to predict our current reality.

Kingsolver has received a number of awards and honors. In 2000, she was awarded the National Humanities Medal by US President Bill Clinton. She is the founder of the PEN/Bellwether Prize for Socially Engaged Fiction.
