

Bridging the Gap - Rebids by Opener

You opened 1 Heart and partner responded 1 NT. What would you bid with the following hand?

Spades 4 Hearts AK8652 Diamonds AJ102 Clubs K7

You have 18 points. If partner is at the top of the range you have 27 or 28 points and game. If they are at the bottom of the range you have 24 or 25 points and cannot make game. A bid of 3 Hearts invites partner to bid game if they are at the top of the range.
