Bridging the Gap – New Suit Invitations

When you are Opener and responder has supported your major suit and you have an invitational hand, you may wish to invite game in the original suit by bidding a different suit. For example, opener 1 spade, responder 2 spades, opener 3 clubs. What does this mean? Opener has 16 to 18 points. With 13 to 16 points opener would pass – 16+9=25. With 19 or more points they would bid 4 spades for game or 4 NT for slam. So what does this new suit bid mean? It means that opener has 2 suits (spades and clubs). This allows responder to decide whether to bid 3 spades or 4 spades basing their decision not only on point count but also on fit.
